

Before School Care

TheirCare offers Before School Care from 6:30am to 8:45am daily for students arriving before 8:45am. School staff are not rostered to supervise students during this time, as they are involved in meetings and planning. If a child needs to be dropped off before 8:45am in a one-off situation, supervision can be arranged by prior agreement with the school staff. Students who regularly arrive before 8:45am need to be booked into Before School Care with TheirCare.

Child Safe Standard 10 – Review of child safety practices

At Mooroopna North PS our work within this standard includes;

Our school ensures child safety policies, procedures and practices are regularly reviewed and improved:

- A register of the school's policies relating to the child safe standards, including approvers and review cycles is used to support staff to maintain and update our policies.
- We determine the causes of child safety incidents and monitor for repeat issues or systemic failures, updating any child safety policy, procedure or practice where gaps or improvements are identified
- We inform families through our school's newsletter when child safety and wellbeing policies are being reviewed and ensure they are invited to provide feedback

Child safety and wellbeing at Mooroopna North Primary School information for families and the school community. The Victorian Government has announced new <u>Child Safe Standards</u> to further strengthen child safety across organisations, including schools. The new standards recognise the critical importance of families and the broader school community in maintaining and promoting child safety and wellbeing.

Mooroopna North Primary School has reviewed and updated our child safety policies and procedures to ensure they meet the requirements of the new standards. These are available to view on the school's website.
