

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Air Ambulance and Rescue Helicopters









As you know, this term we are learning all about Emergency Services. Last week in the Junior room we were looking at Air Ambulances and Rescue Helicopters. We made paper helicopters to experiment and test the motion of rotor propellers and we discovered that; That bigger doesn't mean better, the smaller helicopters flew the best Our paper helicopters could glide in the wind and

go up as well as down, and in different directions. Airplanes and helicopters have different functions and are useful in different situations.

Shepparton Search and Rescue

Two weeks ago, we had a fantastic visit from Matt and Janne, from Shepparton Search and Rescue! They shared information and stories about their incredible VOLUNTEER work in the community, helping to keep us safe in emergencies.

We learned about the importance of teamwork and the tools they use in their daily missions.

We got to get up close to their rescue truck and explore some of the tools inside and even held some equipment to see how heavy it can be.

Janne showed us some real photos from training and actual rescue missions, giving us a glimpse into the challenges they face.

We got to hear the loud sirens, which was thrilling! We looked inside our school's evacuation or 'go bag' for emergencies and discussed how we can all be prepared. A huge thank you to Matt and Janne for their time and for inspiring us to be safety-conscious citizens! Remember, being aware and prepared is the first step in keeping ourselves and our community safe!

As part of our learning this term about emergency services, we had a special visit from Senior Constable Mitchell Bull from the Proactive Police Unit Eyewatch - Greater Shepparton Police Service Area We loved that we could ask Mitchell all of our questions, explored some gear including handcuffs and of course turned on the lights and sirens!



Child Safe Standard 5 – Equity and diverse needs

At Mooroopna North PS our work within this standard includes;

The Child Safe Standards are compulsory minimum standards for all Victorian schools to ensure they are well prepared to keep children and young people safe and protect them from abuse. The Child Safe Standards include requirements to keep children, young people and students safe. There are eleven Child Safe Standards. Each newsletter we will introduce a one standard keeping you informed of our work supporting and implementing the standards.

Before School Care

TheirCare offers Before School Care from 6:30am to 8:45am daily for students arriving before 8:45am. School staff are not rostered to supervise students during this time, as they are involved in meetings and planning. If a child needs to be dropped off before 8:45am in a one-off situation, supervision can be arranged by prior agreement with the school staff. Students who regularly arrive before 8:45am need to be booked into Before School Care with TheirCare.

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Dear parents and carers,

In Term 4, 2024, families with a child enrolled in a government school from Prep to Year 12 in 2025 will receive the one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus.

The \$400 School Saving Bonus provides families with support for education-related costs, such as school activities and/or school uniforms and textbooks.

Actions for parents and carers

Before 18 October 2024, the Department of Education is asking parents and carers to:

- Complete enrolment: If your child, or children are changing government school for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025. For more information, read about Enrolling in School.
- Check your contact information: Ensure your email address and phone number is up to date with us. You can check this information by contacting us directly.

We need to ensure your contact information is up to date as the Department of Education will email you twice:

- in October, to verify your email address
- in November, with your \$400 School Saving Bonus and access to an online system.

Please check your junk mail regularly to make sure you do not miss an important email.

The School Saving Bonus is not available for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.
